



Wake up in the Wild



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Panna National Park

Once the hunting reserves of the erstwhile rulers of Panna, the reserved forests are now a part of the Panna National Park. **River Ken** flowing 55 kms within the sanctuary south to north is home to the Indian reptile **Gharial**. Panna is also home to about 300 species of birds like White Necked Stork, Bar-Headed Goose, Honey Buzzard, King Vulture.

Area Covered: 542.67 sq km

When to go: October- March

Famous for: Tiger, Leopard, Sambar, Nilgai, Crocodile, Sloth Bear

Must do: Visit Panna Diamond Mines; Mahamati Prannathji Mandir; Boat ride for Bird watching; Dhudhwa & Pandava Waterfall

Safari: Morning & Afternoon Jeep

Nearest Airport: Khajuraho (30 kms)



Bandhavgarh National Park

Bandhavgarh was a small tract of protected forest used as gaming reserve in the 12th century. Rewa rulers as a ritual used to kill 109 tigers each to bring them good luck. The park is bound by **River Son** in the east and **River Johill** in the south, and drained by **River Umrer** in the west. Adjoining Panna sanctuary became a part of reserve in 1993 under project Tiger.

Area Covered: 446 sq km

When to go: October-March

Famous for: Royal Bengal Tiger, Leopard, Gaur, over 200 species of birds commonly Kinfisher, Common Peafowl, Red Jungle Fowl, Indian roller etc

Must do: Visit Sandstone caves; Bandhavgarh fort; Baghel museum; Bamera dam for bird watching

Safari: Jeep

Nearest Airport: Jabalpur (193 kms)

Satpura

As core part of the **Pachmarhi** a Tiger Reserve under project full hill region with waterfalls over **1300 species** of plants. here exploring the wilderness

Area Covered: 524 sq km

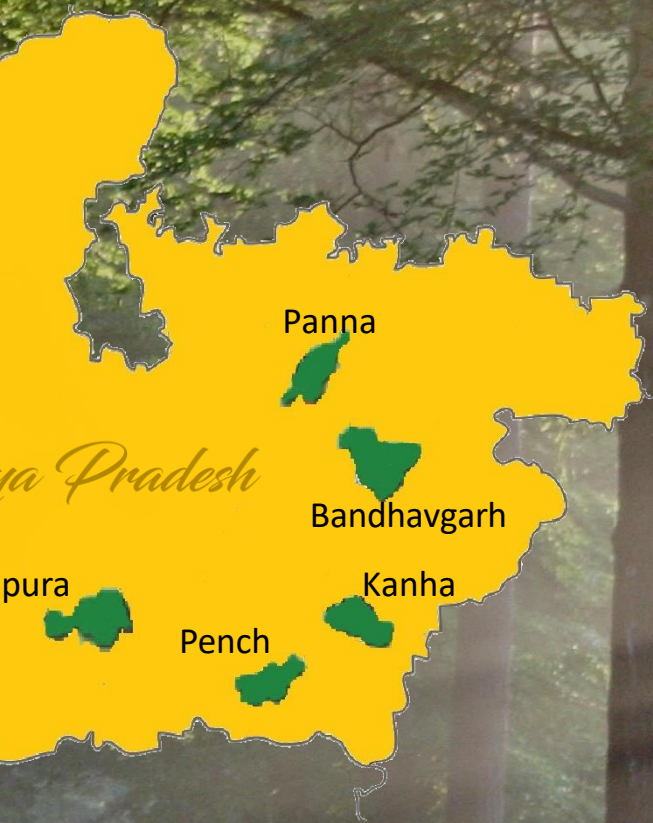
When to go: October-March

Famous for: Tigers, Leopard horned deer and arich variety

Must do: Boating in Denwa

Safari: Jeep; Elephant

Nearest Airport: Bhopal (180 kms)



Kanha National Park

Lush sal and bamboo forests, rolling grasslands and meandering streams are spread across **Central India's largest national park**. Until 1910 Kanha was the hunting grounds of the British. In 1933 it was declared a sanctuary and a national park by 1955. It became globally renowned for saving the **Barasingha** from extinction.

Area Covered: 940 sqkm

When to go: November- March

Famous for: Royal Bengal Tiger, Barasingha (swamp deer), Dholes (wild dogs), Blackbucks, about 200 resident and migratory bird species

Must do: Kanha Museum; Bamni Dadar (Sunset point); Visit to local villages

Safari: Morning & Afternoon Jeep

Nearest Airport: Jabalpur (165 kms)



Pench National Park

Biosphere Reserve, Satpura was notified as a Tiger in 1999-2000. Pachmarhi is a beautiful place with streams and forests. The Park is home to many species of birds. Unlike other parks, you can spend hours on a safari.

leopards, hyenas, Indian bison, golden jackals, four species of birds. Visit Rajat Prapat Waterfall (165 kms)

Pench National Park

Pench came to fame not just for its tigers but also because of the famous author Rudyard Kipling's '**Jungle Book**'. Offering the beauty of Bandhavgarh only less crowded, Pench is a great place to spot wildlife without crossing another vehicle for hours. **Pench River** flows north to south through the reserve.

Area Covered: 293 sqkm

When to go: October- March

Famous for: Tiger, Leopard, Cheetal, Sambhar, Wolf, Wild dogs and pigs; over 285 resident & migratory birds

Must do: Bird watching during sunset at Kohka Lake; Visit Pachdar Potter's Village

Safari: Jeep; Elephant

Nearest Airport: Nagpur (92 kms)

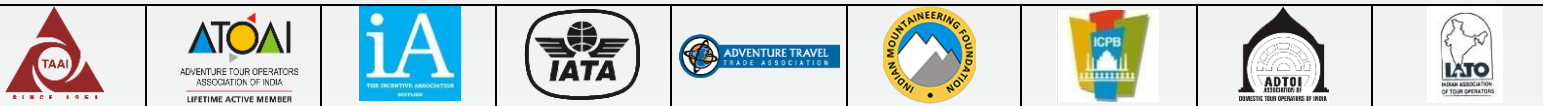
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
